The Initiative for Public Art - Reston to participate in Founder's Week Celebration Honoring Reston Founder Robert E. Simon, Jr.

Reston, VA (March 15, 2016) - Robert E. Simon, Jr. passed away on September 21, 2015 at his home on Lake Anne Plaza. Bob was 101 years young and left a community that experienced his death as a shock despite his age. As community civic and non-profit organizations began planning for Reston's annual Founder's Day event in 2016, it became evident that the scope and number of commemorative activities would expand. Thus Founder's Day for 2016 has evolved into Founder's Week. From Sunday, April 3 at Lake Anne Plaza, to Sunday, April 10 at Reston Town Center, and throughout the week at many locations throughout the community, we will remember our founder, his incredible life and the legacy he leaves. Few people can claim to have established not just a "new town" but even more remarkably, a new way of living in the United States. Planned events will celebrate Bob's vision, his love of the arts, the impact of his bold venture on land use in the United States and how his fervent desire to create a thriving community has been realized in Reston.

The Founder's Week celebrations will give those who live, work and play in Reston a chance to reconnect to Bob and the spirit of his life.

Documentary Screening: Levitated Mass

<u>Levitated Mass</u> is the story of a rock star; the artist behind the sensation; and the international media storm that ensued – but not in the way you might expect. Prominently displayed outside the Los Angeles (Museum of Art, renowned and reclusive land artist Michael Heizer's *Levitated Mass* gained worldwide recognition during its installation in 2012. Over the course of 10 nights, a 340-ton solid granite boulder crawled through Southern California neighborhoods on a 294-foot-long, 206-wheeled trailer, drawing

hundreds of camera crews and cell phone shooters alike to document its journey. Tens of thousands of people came out to watch the megalith travel through their communities to its final resting place over a 456-foot-long negative space formed by a concrete slot. **Levitated Mass** is one of the only pieces of art in recent history to inspire such a reaction in pop culture, bringing together the art community, public officials, and the general population to debate the merits and pitfalls of a giant stone suspended above their heads.

This movie is presented by Reston Community Center in collaboration with the Initiative for Public Art – Reston (IPAR). IPAR seeks to inspire an ongoing commitment to public art and create a new generation of artworks in Reston. Thanks to RCC's support, IPAR developed this documentary film series to present exceptional public art projects. Visually stimulating and thought-provoking, the movies are shown to foster a community conversation about public art.

Join the Reston Historic Trust & Museum as we celebrate Robert E. Simon, Jr. and our community. Founder's Day will feature a 50-foot Ferris wheel sponsored by Reston Association (RA), children's activities, children's art projects in cooperation with the Initiative for Public Art - Reston (IPAR), musical entertainment for all ages provided by local artists and schools, guided walks around Lake Anne Plaza in cooperation with IPAR and RA, and remarks by local elected officials. The event will be fun for the entire family.

On this special Founder's Day, Lake Anne of Reston Condominium Association (LARCA) and IPAR partnered to commission a new version of *The Wooden Horse* originally created by artist Gonzalo Fonseca in 1965. The sculpture was first installed on grass, as in a pasture, and was later moved to a brick walkway, not far from *The Building*, another sculpture created by Fonseca. Because both sculptures were made of wood, they have been lost to the effects of time. Like the other sculptures at Lake Anne Plaza, *The Horse* was meant to be played on. This new version of *The Wooden Horse* was constructed by Reston artist Marco Rando. Please check out the dining and drink specials at Lake Anne all week.
