

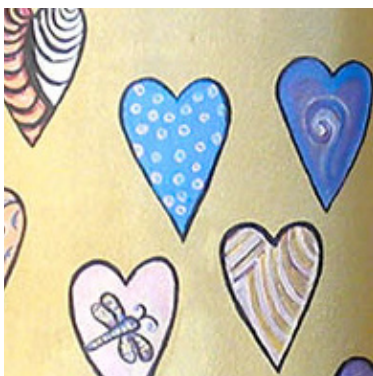
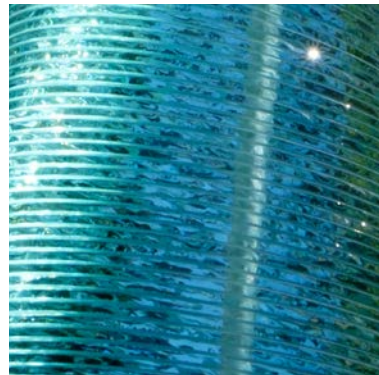


## Public Art is Everywhere

# What is Public Art Reston?

## *At a Glance*

- Public Art Reston seeks to inspire an ongoing commitment to public art and create a new generation of artworks in Reston that are world-renowned, inspire the community, and engage the mind and senses.
- Public Art Reston is a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt nonprofit organization founded in 2007.
- Public art has always been a part of Reston's tradition. Building on a 50-year tradition first initiated by founder Robert E. Simon Jr., a group of Reston civic and community organizations and leaders joined together to develop a vision and plan for cultivating a new generation of public artworks throughout the community.
- Public Art Reston is creating new expectations about the possibilities of art in the public realm and is cultivating a new generation of artworks in the community that are engaging, memorable, and recognized for their artistic excellence.
- In 2008, as the first step in bringing world-class public art to the community, Public Art Reston launched a process to create a world-class public art master plan for Reston. In addition to detailing an overall vision and plan, the public art master plan includes recommendations for projects, suggestions about how to fund the projects, and descriptions of the roles different organizations will play in the successful realization of Reston's public art ambitions.
